"Jazz on the Ave" is one of Beech's ways of giving back to the Cecil B. Moore community. "We thought it would be a good way to bring community residents together to meet and greet while enjoying a free, fun and enjoyable event for the entire family," stated Christine Brown, Director of Beech Community Services and organizer of the festival. The festival will include music, food and fun. There will be many activities for the kids including balloon twisting, moon bounce, face painting and Smith Playground. We will also have Guardian Protection Services for fingerprinting for children identification cards. From 12:30-4:30pm the festival will focus on the health and

wellness for the community by providing free health screenings, social services and free document shredding where you can bring up to 4 copy paper boxes.
